




Welcome to Residential College 4!

We also have a large selection of sports teams, and arts and lifestyle groups. To top it off, RC4 offers a dynamic student leadership development platform, where students can serve on the College Students' Committee, or the House Committees, or as Resident Assistants.

Our Resident Assistants are supervised by staff Resident Fellows and trained to handle a variety of "crisis" situations, and have truly touched the lives of hundreds of their peers in the College. Through all these activities, our residents grow holistically. They cultivate important life skills and forge lasting friendships that will benefit them throughout their lives.

RC4 students are willing to step out of their comfort zone and step up to these opportunities because they feel a sense of safety and that they are being cared for in the College. Every semester, our student welfare directors go into overdrive. They deliver goodies to their peers, and bring comfort to them through the many bonding activities at the College, House and Floor levels. RC4 is tremendously proud of its residents. Academic Programme

The UTown College Programme (UTCP) is a unique programme read by students in UTown residential colleges in replacement of the NUS General Education pathway. It encourages multidisciplinary learning to broaden students' perspectives. In RC4, our seminars are centered around Systems Thinking – developing effective solutions to complex humankind problems by recognising the relationships between constituent parts of a system, rather than looking at them individually. This focus on Systems Thinking is what makes RC4 courses different from other residential colleges!





The RC4 building consists of 17 floors and has a total of 600 single rooms for residents.












Admissions

Ultimately, if you do not receive an application offer from NUS, your acceptance into RC4 will also be negated. If you choose not to apply during this period, you will no longer be able to apply after the application window closes.
